Meeting Minutes of the H-GAC Board of Directors December 19, 2023

CALL TO ORDER

The Honorable Trey Duhon, Waller County Judge and Chair of the Board called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. on Tuesday, December 19, 2023, at 3555 Timmons Lane.

1. INVOCATION

The Honorable Stacy Adams, Brazoria County Commissioner, gave the invocation.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Honorable Phillip Spenrath, Wharton County Judge, led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Pledge to the Texas Flag.

ROLL CALL

Chair Duhon asked Rick Guerrero to conduct the Board of Directors roll call. Mr. Guerrero conducted the roll call and announced that a quorum was present.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

Chair Duhon invited comments from any members of the public who wished to participate during the meeting and asked Mr. Guerrero if any requests for public comments had been received. Mr. Guerrero called on Peter Eccles of Link Houston to come forward for a public comment. Mr. Eccles is the Policy and Planning Coordinator for Link Houston, a non-profit organization that advocates for a robust transportation network in Houston. Mr. Eccles shared his encouragement with the Houston-Galveston Area Council's processes in fostering regional cooperation under Houston's Proposition B. Chair Duhon asked if there were any more public comments. There being none, Chair Duhon proceeded to the next item on the agenda.

4. DECLARE CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Chair Duhon called for any Board member with a conflict of interest to declare it at that time. Hearing no conflicts, Chair Duhon proceeded to the next item on the agenda.

SAFETY TIP OF THE MONTH

Chair Duhon asked Jim Rouse, H-GAC Facilities Manager, to bring this month's safety tip. Mr. Rouse gave a brief presentation regarding the dangers of electrical outlets and appliances during the winter holidays.

5. CONSENT AGENDA

Chair Duhon called for the Consent Agenda and asked if there were any questions or items that required discussion. Mayor Joe Zimmerman asked to remove item 5D from the Consent Agenda. There being no further questions, Mayor Joe Zimmerman moved to approve the Consent Agenda, except item 5D. Mayor Pro Tem Johnnie Simpson seconded the motion. Chair Duhon then called for a vote, which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present. Chair Duhon asked Chuck Wemple, H-GAC Executive Director, to discuss item 5D. Mayor Joe Zimmerman motioned to approve item 5D of the Consent Agenda. Councilmember Sally Branson seconded the motion. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon then called for a vote, which resulted in a unanimous approval by all members present.

a. H-GAC BOARD MEETING MINUTES – NOVEMBER 21, 2023 – approved the minutes of the November 21, 2023, H-GAC Board Meeting minutes.

- b. CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT HOUSTON ADVANCED RESEARCH CENTER – authorized to enter into an interlocal agreement with Houston Advanced Research Center for transportation planning and Climate Pollution Reduction Grant program activities; \$250,000 contract.
- **c. DATA CABLING CONTRACT AMENDMENT** approved to amend the contract with i.e. Smart Systems for \$15,299 for data cabling services; total contract amount of \$54,972.
- **d. UPDATE TO H-GAC PERSONNEL POLICY** approved to remove the new employee introductory period with the corresponding benefits and policy changes.

6. FINANCE AND BUDGET COMMITTEE a. Monthly Financial Report – November 2023

Chair Duhon announced that the Finance and Budget Committee met before the Board of the Directors meeting under the leadership of the Committee Vice Chair, City of Sugar Land Mayor Joe Zimmerman. He recognized Mayor Zimmerman, who reported that the committee met to consider several items on the agenda.

Judge Knight recognized Christina Ordonez-Campos, H-GAC Director of Finance, to present the financial status report for November. Mrs. Ordonez-Campos requested approval of the monthly financial report ending November 31, 2023.

Mrs. Ordonez-Campos asked if there were any questions regarding the November financial report. There being none, Mayor Zimmerman moved to approve, and Council Member Jeffrey Boney seconded the motion. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote, which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present.

7. BUDGET AND SERVICE PLAN

a. Public Hearing for 2024 H-GAC Budget and Service Plan

Chair Duhon called for a recess of the board of directors meeting at 10:27 A.M. and opened the public hearing at 10:28 A.M. Chair Duhon called on Chuck Wemple, H-GAC Executive Director, to present the 2024 budget and service plan. Mr. Wemple asked if there were any questions or comments, hearing none Chair Duhon concluded the public hearing at 10:36 A.M.

Chair Duhon called to resume the board of directors meeting at 10:37 A.M. and asked if there were any questions. With no additional discussion, and no action required Chair Duhon proceeded to the next item on the agenda.

b. Presentation of H-GAC 2024 Budget and Service Plan

Chair Duhon called on H-GAC Executive Director, Chuck Wemple, who requested approval of the H-GAC 2024 Budget and Service Plan.

Chair Duhon asked if there were any questions. There being none, Mayor Zimmerman moved to approve, and Council Member Jeffery Boney seconded the motion. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote, which resulted in unanimous approval by all

8. DATA ANALYTICS AND RESEARCH

a. 2024 Regional Light Detection and Ranging Data Agreements

Chair Duhon called on H-GAC Geospatial Program Lead, Thushara Ranatunga, who requested approval to enter into Interlocal agreements with fifteen partner organizations for the acquisition and processing of high-resolution LIDAR data; and to enter into a Joint Funding Agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey for a combined total of \$2,824,770.

Chair Duhon asked if there were any questions. There being none, Mayor Kevin Cole moved to approve, and Mayor Pro Tem Johnnie Simpson moved seconded the motion. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present.

9. HUMAN SERVICES

a. Workforce Solutions Financial Aid Center - Contract Agreement

Chair Duhon called on H-GAC Senior Manager, AJ Dean, who requested approval to amend the current fiscal year 22024 contract with Equus for operating the Workforce Solutions – Gulf Coast Financial Aid Support Center for an increase of \$1,600,000; the total contract amount of \$11,600,000.

Chair Duhon asked if there were any questions. There being none, Mayor Zimmerman moved to approve, and Mayor Kevin Cole moved seconded the motion. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present.

10. COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING

a. Solid Waste Management Grants – Fiscal Years 2024 - 2025

Chair Duhon called on H-GAC Principal Planner, Erin Livingston, who requested authorization to contract with recommended applicants for the fiscal year 2024-2025 solid waste management funds in the amount of \$981,099.

Chair Duhon asked if there were any questions. There being none, Judge Phillip Spenrath moved to approve, and Council Member Sally Branson moved seconded the motion. Chair Duhon spoke briefly requesting larger future efforts in solid waste management funding. Mr. Wemple commented that a report with solid waste management success stories and return on investment rates across the state of Texas is compiled annually and available online on the Texas Association of Regional Councils website. With no further discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present.

b. Parks and Natural Areas Awards Resolution

Chair Duhon called on H-GAC Principal Communications Coordinator, Andrea Tantillo, who requested the adoption of a resolution recognizing January 2024 as Parks and Natural Areas Month in support of the Parks and Natural Areas Awareness Program.

Chair Duhon asked if there were any questions. There being none, Mayor Zimmerman moved to approve, and Council Member Nancy Arnold moved to second the motion. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present.

11. ELECTION COMMITTEE

a. 2023 Election Committee – 2024 H-GAC Board Officers

Chair Duhon called on Council Member Sally Branson, who requested approval of the Election Committee's recommendation for 2024 H-GAC officers, and authorization to issue General Assembly ballots. The Election Committee's recommendation for 2024 H-GAC officers is: City of Houston Councilmember Sallie Alcorn – Chair, Liberty County Judge Jay Knight – Chair-Elect, and City of Pattinson Mayor Joe Garcia – Vice Chair. Mr. Wemple commented that if the board approves the committee's recommendation the next step would be to send ballots to the general assembly and results would be shared at H-GAC's Annual Meeting.

Chair Duhon asked if there were any questions. There being none, Council Member Nancy Arnold moved to approve, and Council Member Laura Alvarado moved to second the motion. Chair Duhon commented on his support for the recommended slate. With no additional discussion, Chair Duhon called for the vote which resulted in unanimous approval by all members present.

Mr. Wemple also discussed previous county pop-ups where new topics such as community safety are becoming a growing concern. AREA AGENCY ON AGING CONTRACT RECOMMENDATION

Background

H-GAC is the Area Agency on Aging for Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller and Wharton counties. Each year we contract with organizations to provide services for individuals aged sixty and older, including nutrition (congregate and home-delivered meals); transportation; and direct services such as personal assistance and respite care, residential repair, health maintenance, emergency response, and health promotion. Fiscal Year 2024 Aging programs begin October 1, 2023 and end September 30, 2024.

Current Situation

2024 Funding

In an effort to increase our number of home healthcare providers, we issued requests for proposals for new contractors to provide personal assistance and respite care services. We recommend contracting with two additional providers for the balance of the fiscal year. New contractors will provide approximately 4,800 hours of home healthcare service.

The proposal review committee scored each proposal based on experience and capability, program plan, and fiscal responsibility. We recommend funding proposers scoring 75 or higher. We do not recommend funding proposers who scored 74 or less, those applicants are CHOSEN J-X INC., Consider the Lilies Home Care, FCM Group, LLC. Dba Nurse Next Door, BBH Life Care, LLC., Always Best Care Senior Services, International Cargo and Logistics, LLC. Dba Tomori Medical Supplies and Services, Granny's Helping Hand, and A Better Solution In-Home Care.

H-GAC maintains a network of authorized providers for direct services such as personal assistance and respite care, residential repair, health maintenance, and emergency response. Eligible consumers select from the available organizations for the specific service they need.

The Aging and Disability Advisory Committee approved funding at its December 21, 2023 committee meeting.



INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

I. OBJECTIVES

- Understand suitability of investments to the financial requirements of H-GAC
- Preservation and safety of principal
- Financial security and liquidity of H-GAC funds
- Ability to liquidate investments before their maturity should the need arise.
- Diversification of the investment portfolio.
- Maximize interest yield of funds through methods allowed under Federal and State law.

II. RESPONSIBILITY

Planning the investment program is the joint responsibility of the Director of Finance, the Executive Director, the Chief Financial Officer and the Investment Officer(s). The investment program shall be reviewed and approved by the Budget and Finance Committee and Board of Directors prior to its institution. Any policy changes require similar approval.

A primary & a secondary investment officer must be designated an approved by the Budget and Finance Committee and the Board of Directors. The investment officers will be responsible for effectively supervising and managing the assets of the investment fund.

H-GAC investments shall be made with judgement and care under circumstances then prevailing that persons of prudence, discretion, and intelligence exercise the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived.

III AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS

The following are authorized investments for H-GAC funds:

- 1. Obligations of the United States or its agencies and instrumentalities.
- 2. Direct obligations of the State of Texas or its agencies.
- 3. Other obligations, the principal of the interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed or insured by the State of Texas or the United States.
- 4. General obligations of states, agencies, counties, cities, and other political subdivisions of any state having been rated as to investment quality by a nationally recognized investment rating firm and having received a rating of not less than A or its equivalent.

- 5. Certificates of Deposit issued by State and National banks domiciled in the State of Texas the payment of which is insured in full by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.
- 6. Fully collateralized direct Repurchase Agreements with a defined termination date purchased pursuant to a master contractual agreement which specified the rights and obligations of both parties, and which requires that securities involved in the transaction be held in a safekeeping account subject to the control and custody of H-GAC.
- 7. No Load Money Market Mutual Funds and No-Load Mutual Funds. To be an allowable investment, money market funds must adhere to a 90-day weighted average maturity. No-load mutual funds with a weighted average maturity of up to 2 years are allowable if they are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, invest exclusively in obligations authorized by the Public Funds Investment Act, adhere to the requirements set forth for investment pools and are continuously rated by at least one nationally recognized investment rating firm at not less than AAA or its equivalent. A government may invest no more than 15% of its operating funds (excluding bond proceeds, reserves, and debt service funds) in this type of mutual fund.
- 8. Time deposits in the Council's depositories.
- 9. Investment pools created to function as money market funds must markto-market daily and maintain a market value ratio between .995 and 1.005. These pools must be continuously rated no lower than AAA, AAA-m or an equivalent rating by at least one nationally recognized rating agency.
- 10. Banker's Acceptances 1)270 days or fewer, 2) Liquidated in full at maturity, 3) Eligible Federal Reserve Bank collateral,4) U.S. Bank rated not less than A-1 or P-1.
- 11. Any combination of the foregoing.

Any law passed by the Texas State legislature changing the scope of legal investments available to a Council of Governments shall be considered included as part of this Investment Policy.

H-GAC monitors investments upon each maturity and compares interest rates offered from various brokers and the state of Texas to assure that rates are competitive for the market. Such comparisons are reviewed by the investment officer(s) and the CFO before investments are made. The comparison analysis is retained for review.

IV MATURITY OF INVESTMENTS

The Council measures interest rate risk using the weighted average maturity method based on the fund in which the Council makes investments. For pooled funds, the portfolio is measured using the dollar-weighted average maturity allowed based on the stated maturity date for the portfolio as a whole. (2256.005c)

Portfolio maturities will be structured to meet the liquidity needs of H-GAC first and then to achieve the highest prudent return of interest. When H-GAC has funds that will not be needed to meet current-year obligations, maturity restraints will be imposed based upon H-GAC's investment strategy for each fund. The maximum allowable stated maturity of any individual investment owned by H-GAC is five years unless specific authority is given to exceed this limit.

Reserve funds may be invested in securities exceeding five years if the maturity of such investments is made to coincide as nearly as practicable with the expected use of funds. Any proposed investments in securities exceeding five years maturity must be disclosed to and approved by the Budget and Finance Committee and the Board of Directors including any appropriate time restrictions. The settlement of all transactions, except investment pool funds and mutual funds, is on a delivery versus a payment basis.

I. COLLATERALIZATION REQUIREMENTS

H-GAC's depository accounts must be collateralized. The H-GAC Budget and Finance Committee and the Board of Directors shall select the form of securities pledge contract or surety bond used to secure H-GAC funds. Additional, substitution, or withdrawal of collateral for H-GAC funds shall be subject to approval of H-GAC's Board of Directors.

The Investment Officer is authorized to accept from depositories of H-GAC funds, as security for deposits, the following kinds of securities: Direct obligations of the United States of America backed by its full faith and credit; evidence of indebtedness guaranteed by Federal Intermediate Credit Banks, Federal Land Banks, Banks for Cooperative, Federal Farm Credit System, Federal Home Loan Banks, Federal National Mortgage Association; any general or special obligations (approved by the Attorney General of Texas) issued by a State of Texas public agency payable from taxes, revenues, either or both, provided all of such obligations are rated A or better by a generally recognized national bondrating agency.

At all times, such securities shall have a market value of not less than 100% of the amount of the deposits secured thereby, adjusted by the insurance coverage provided those deposits by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

VI WRITTEN CERTIFICATION FROM INVESTMENT FIRMS

H-GAC may conduct business with any broker licensed to do business in the State of Texas and authorized to negotiate transactions on the national stock exchange. Qualified brokers will be approved by H-GAC's Budget and Finance Committee and Board of Directors to conduct investment transactions on behalf of the Council. Any business organization which seeks to sell an authorized investment

to H-GAC must provide a written instrument certifying that they have received and thoroughly reviewed H-GAC's investment policy and have implemented reasonable procedures and controls in an effort to preclude imprudent or noncompliant investment activities arising from investment transactions.

The governing body of an entity subject to this subchapter or the designated investment committee of the entity shall, at least annually, review, revise, and adopt a list of qualified brokers that are authorized to engage in investment transactions with the entity.

VII PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

The Investment Officer is prohibited from:

- 1. shorting securities;
- 2. selling calls on securities owned by H-GAC;
- 3. entering into reverse repurchase agreements;
- 4. trading in options or futures contracts;
- 5. purchasing mortgage-backed derivatives known as principal only (PO's), interest only (IO's) and inverse floaters;
- 6. purchasing or selling securities from dealers or public depositories other than those approved by the Budget and Finance Committee;
- 7. making any other investment transaction on behalf of H-GAC that is prohibited by law or that has not been authorized by the Budget and Finance Committee.

VIII REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The investment officer is responsible for preparing and submitting quarterly written reports of investment transactions and performance to the Budget and Finance Committee and the Executive Director as described in the Public Funds Investment Act. The report must:

- 1. Describe in detail the investment position of H-GAC on the date of the report;
- 2. Be prepared and signed by the investment officer;
- 3. State the book value and market value of each separately invested asset at the beginning and end of the reporting period by the type of asset and fund type invested;
- 4. State the maturity date of each directly held separate asset that has a maturity date;
- 5. Contain a summary statement of each pooled fund group that states the:
 - a. beginning and ending market values for the reporting period, and
 - b. additions and changes to the market value during the period;
- 6. State the compliance of the investment portfolio of H-GAC as it relates to:
 - a. the investment strategy expressed in H-GAC's investment policy, and
 - b. relevant provisions of Government Code Section 2256.023;

7. State the percentage of the total portfolio which each type of investment represents.

In conjunction with H-GAC's annual financial audit, a compliance audit shall be performed for management controls on investment and adherence to the H-GAC's investment policies.

If the investment officer has a personal business relationship with an entity or is within the second degree by affinity or consanguinity to an individual seeking to sell an investment to H-GAC, the investment officer must file a statement disclosing that personal business interest, or relationship, with the Texas Ethics Commission, the Budget and Finance Committee, and the Board of Directors.

In addition, investment pools must provide investment officers with a disclosure instrument which contains specific and detailed information. Investment pools must provide investment officers with transaction confirmations and a detailed monthly report.

IX CONTINUING EDUCATION

It is H-GAC's policy to provide training required by the Public Funds Investment Act and periodic training in investments for the investment officer through courses and seminars offered by professional organizations and associations in order to insure the quality, capability, and currency of the investment officer in making investment decisions. The Chief Financial Officer and investment officer(s) shall attend at least one training session relating to their investment responsibilities within 12 months of assuming duties this initial training must contain at least ten hours of instruction relating to their respective responsibilities under the Public Funds Investment Act. *Gov't Code 2256.008 (a)*.

The Chief Financial Officer and the investment officer(s) shall attend an investment training session not less than once in a two year period that begins on the first day of the agency's fiscal year and consists of the two consecutive fiscal years after that date, and receive not less than eight hours of instruction relating to investment responsibilities under the Public Funds Investment Act from an independent source approved by the board or by the Budget & Finance Committee advising the investment officer. *Gov't Code 2256.008(a-1)*.

X ANNUAL REVIEW

The board shall review its investment policy and investment strategies not less than annually. The board shall adopt a written instrument by rule, order, ordinance, or resolution stating that it has reviewed the investment policy and investment strategies and that the written instrument so adopted shall record any changes made to either the investment policy or investment strategies. *Gov't Code* 2256.005(e).

XI NOTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT CHANGES

It shall be the duty of the investment officer(s) to notify the Budget and Finance Committee of any significant changes in current investment methods and procedures prior to their implementation, regardless of whether they are authorized by this policy or not.
